- Students enrolled in the School of Law may receive up to 15 units of credit for courses taken in other disciplines for which graduate credit is given so long as such work is not duplicative of work undertaken when the student requesting credit was an undergraduate and providing that the material covered in the non-law course is not covered by any course offered by the law faculty.
- No more than 20 units of credit will be given for externships and non-law course work combined.
- To receive credit, the course **must be graded** and the student must have received a grade of 2.7 or better. Normally, only 400- or graduate-level courses will be approved.
- Approval for credit will be based upon a showing that such course work will contribute significantly to the student's professional legal education.
